PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT/WORKSHOP SESSION SERIES FOR EDUCATIONAL PROFESSIONALS

These sessions are relevant for district personnel engaged in understanding and providing the skills needed for a future workforce. Sessions are open, but not limited to: educators, administrators, school counselors, career counselors/coordinators, co-op coordinators, transition, and other relevant staff. Session topics were chosen from surveys.

Session Objectives:

- Personal and Professional development to assist with alignment of Comprehensive Counseling Plans (339 Mandate), CEW Standards, and in preparation to align with Pennsylvania's "Future Ready PA" to be launched c. Fall 2018. This includes understanding and incorporating PA's Workforce needs into your current and new curriculum and efforts.
- To provide a learning platform designed to both enhance individual personal/professional development, but also to provide learning that attendees may utilize in their schools to teach students, mentor students, and/or educate peers. This includes personal/professional development and modeling of Leadership.
- To leave each session with an action plan for specific measurable and actionable College and Career Readiness tools that can and should be implemented upon the attendee's return to their school.

Sessions are open to all regional schools. Priority registration is provided for CRPCD member districts. There is a \$5 fee for CRPCD members, and a \$10 fee for non-CRPCD members to attend, which includes lunch, materials and three Act 48 credits (Session 1 provides five Act 48 credits). Open to all relevant district personnel. Limited seating. Priority registration is open for CRPCD members until October 1, 2017.

Combining the PA description of College and Career Readiness and the gateway of introduction to the PA Future Ready Index, we will review with the group "what students need to receive," a state perspective on K-12 career development implementation. This will include integration of the CEW Standards, instruction for every strand at every level.

The strategic concepts of stakeholder engagement and distribution/use of graduation follow-up data will be featured.

The sharing of resources and interventions among districts will provide a backdrop for increased innovative program development for everyone. Seating limited to 60.
