

A sample of Career One Stop's ability needs for construction:

- Problem Sensitivity Noticing when problems happen.
- Oral Expression Communicating by speaking.
- Visualization Imagining how something will look after it is moved around or changed.
- Written Comprehension Reading and understanding what is written.
- Deductive Reasoning Using rules to solve problems.
- Oral Comprehension Listening and understanding what people say.
- Inductive Reasoning Making general rules or coming up with answers from lots of detailed information.

TECH 360 - TECHNOLOGY

Skills for careers in these fields often include (from Career One Stop):

- Critical Thinking Thinking about the pros and cons of different ways to solve a problem.
- Writing Writing things for co-workers or customers.

- Reading Comprehension Reading work-related information.
- Active Listening Listening to others, not interrupting, and asking good questions.
- Coordination Changing what is done based on other people's actions.




